

## **Green Haven Anoka Men's Club New Handicap Information**



New Handicap Rules	Old Handicap Rules
1 - Best 8 of last 20 rounds used	Best 10 of last 20 rounds used
2 - New index every day	New index twice a month - 1st and 15th
3 - Course conditions can impact index Determined by the day's course posts	Course conditions not used
4 - Minimum of 3 rounds (54 holes) for legal handicap - 9/18 combined	Minimum of 5 rounds (90 holes) for legal handicap - 9/18 combined
5 - Maximum handicap of 54 for all	Maximum handicap of 36 with local options
6 - Handicap posting double bogey + hole handicap A 12 handicap player can only post a double bogey plus one on handicap holes 1-12 and only a double bogey on handicap holes 13-18.	Handicap Equitable posting determined by handicap grouping  Handicap 0-9 = double bogey  Handicap 10-19 = high of 7  Handicap 20-29 = high of 8  Handicap 30-39 = high of 9
7 - While you can still post total scores, it is better to post hole-by-hole so the computer can use your course handicap	It was a lot easier with the old system
8 - Green Haven Men's Club members will now post their own Thursday scores	Handicap Chair posted all Thursday scores
9 - Handicap Chair will post tournament scores	Handicap Chair posted tournament scores
<ul> <li>10 - Handicap Chair will now audit a percentage of Thursday and event scores and will correct any incorrectly posted scores</li> </ul>	Did not audit postings unless asked
<ul> <li>11 - When an exceptional score is posted, a member's handicap index will be automatically reduced</li> </ul>	An algorithm was used when daily scores and tournament scores were found to be significantly different.
EXCEPTIONAL = strokes under index 7.0 - 9.9 net strokes under course index (69.4) = 1.0 reduction if score minus handicap is 62.4 - 60.3 10.0 + net strokes under course index = 2.0 reduction if score minus handicap is >/= 59.4	

This reduction can be made with a single **daily** posting and will be **cumulative** for each round played with an exceptional score

Two exceptional **tournament** scores were needed to impact the index algorithm

12 - Any index reduction will last until the exceptional score is dropped due to the number of scores used to determine index

A tournament score stayed on the card for one year

The course handicap committee has/had the power to override any reduction for an exceptional score if it considers that the adjustment would result in a player's Handicap Index not being a fair reflection of a player's demonstrated ability.
